THE TEST OF INJUSTICE

Christian workers are more vulnerable to bitterness than almost

Christian workers are more vulnerable to bitterness than almost any other people. This is because their personal idealism and expectations of one another are so high.

Someone without Christ is usually protected by a wall of personal cynicism. A man finding that his car has been stolen may curse and then comment, "Well, that's life." His expectation of his fellow man is so low that the 'rip-off' comes as no big surprise.



On the other hand, an idealistic person, having volunteered their life to Jesus through apprenticeship to some ministry, can be shattered by the failure of some all-too-human leader. Ps. 146:3 says, "Do not trust in princes, in mortal man, in whom there is no salvation."

I think the greatest difficulty of being in ministry is relating to authority with tolerance and forgiveness, by seeing the hand of God in my circumstances. The **failure to forgive** must be one of the greatest reasons that Christians get stalled in their personal growth and ministry. I have noticed a puzzling thing. Some of the most vital, fruitful, Christ-centered ministries - mission societies, youth movements, television ministries, churches - are also those with some of the most bitter critics among their previously employed workers and former members. Why is this?

Either these ministries are riddled with corrupt leadership (if so, we are left with nothing but cynical thoughts and an independent spirit), or we as individuals are failing to respond to the dealings of God in our own lives through human authority.

Consider the testing of the young man Joseph. First, he receives his vision of personal ministry and is rejected by his brothers. The dream leads to the pit. Next he finds himself in slavery, and worse still - thrown into prison, unjustly accused of rape.

This can be likened to someone who gives their all to God expecting to be released immediately into the fulfillment of their ministry fantasies. A year or two of 'slavery' or 'unrewarding labor' may be a test of faithfulness. Then, after faithfully serving Jesus, some misunderstanding or conflict arises in which they (as innocent as Joseph), feel the lash of unjust criticism or are demoted or even dismissed. This is the point of the test where they struggle with resentment and self-pity, the place where so many fail in God's preparation for a fruitful ministry. A sovereign and loving God allowed Joseph to go through such tests. Joseph passed his tests because he lived in forgiveness. We too must

Not long ago, 60 Minutes, the ever-popular CBS television weekly magazine, had a piece from France about the paradox that is apparent in the way people eat and die. It seems that the French have 50% fewer heart attacks for roughly the same amount of fat consumed.

One proposal would have us eat French cheese and chase it with a bottle of red wine, and this could be one explanation for the so-called "French Paradox." On the other hand, it has been noted that the French have double the number of deaths from cirrhosis of the liver, caused in part, by the red wine!

A more likely explanation however, is that the French are emotionally involved "with the table." They come together to savor, to talk and to linger long enough to actually digest what they consume. Add to this their serving sizes of rich foods, which are about 30% less than North American "pioneer portions," and you could have a simple answer.

We know we're **not** what we eat, because we're spiritual beings. But we **are** in fact what we digest, both spiritually and physically; and physically, proper digestion involves chewing, so that the food combines with enzymes that collect in the mouth before we swallow. Then, giving God's marvelous mechanism enough time to do

its thing, we can be off and running to our next event!

Essentially, this means giving more time to to the entire cooking and eating process. And in a real sense, actually recognizing with gratitude, that we have enough to eat, when so many - possibly 480 million people - have so little, as to risk death by starvation. I was asked recently in a university teaching hospital, to come up with a simple sentence that could make a major difference to

someone who is trying to make a creative change in their eating habits, and actually increase their pleasure.

I've got a new word to describe what this means. It's called CAREPLEASING. You change the way you cook and serve, then linger over your food because you CARE; then you select good, tasty, colorful, crisp,

fresh, aromatic foods, because you want to PLEASE.

Bingo! You're a carepleaser and not just a fast-paced peoplepleaser...

Now wouldn't you think God would bless such a change?

Lighten up, try it and see!

story is an astounding testimony of what God will do with the man or woman whose spirit is purified by the choice to forgive in ever-worsening conditions. Human authority cannot ruin your life or ministry as long as you continue to forgive and look up to Jesus who sees all things.

The ministry, church, mission or organization that you are part of, is just a circumstance that Jesus has led you into. Submit joyfully to human authority appointed and anointed by God, because He intends that healing, teaching and direction come from Him, through them. But if you suffer injustice, rush into the presence of the Lord, seek His comfort, thrive on His encouragement and get His opinion of you. Seeing yourself as God sees you is the key to self-acceptance and personal humility. If you don't find your comfort in God you may run to man as a disloyal talebearer, a bitter backbiter or a

manipulative gossip, spilling resentment into the hearts of others and destroying the unity of the body of Christ.

You may be asking, "Is the test of injustice an essential step in my Christian development?" Yes, for even Jesus "learned obedience through the things that He suffered." He is our example in all things, and it is a privilege to be involved in the "fellowship of His sufferings."




