# THE JOURNEY BACK

Going was easy. The journey back was tough.

I had been eight years with Mercy Ships, through forty countries; I had sensed God's heart cry for the lost, the lonely and the hurting; and here I was, having a major struggle in re-entering my own world. At times it was over—whelmingly traumatic and I asked myself some questions. . . .

....Can I fit into the mainstream of Christian life at home? Where will I find a job that will be fulfilling? How can I share my experiences without making people feel guilty because they didn't "GO"? Where will I live? To whom shall I go to get healed of the very real pain and wounding from having been on the frontlines of missions? Is there life after YWAM?

Missions is a spiritual battlefield, and there are casualties. God uses the battles (and the wounds), to refine us, promising to use everything we go through - even injustices - for good. For me, I recognized my condition and my need for a safe place where I could share my deepest pain and allow God to heal and renew me.

I was given the book "Re-Entry" but it came three months too late for me. As I read it I wept. I realized I wasn't alone in my feelings of lostness and hopelessness. Then along came IN TOUCH and an invitation to a "Renewal" Camp. Dan Sneed - a favorite YWAM speaker of mine - would be there. Feeling like a fish out of water, lacking purpose, direction and meaning in my life, I signed up, sensing that I needed to reconnect with YWAM.

"No Expectations" characterized my attitude as I arrived at Camp - I wouldn't be disappointed if nothing good happened. But I did tell God that I couldn't leave without meeting Him face-to-face and getting to the root of my problems. I had come to a place in my life where I wasn't sure I could trust anyone - maybe even God. But somehow I felt I could trust Dan, so I asked God to speak to me through him.

Dan's first message was about storms in our lives. Could I relate! It seemed like my life had been one long, continuous hurricane. The tears flowed freely as the Lord gave Dan understanding about the 'lock-ups' in my life; then he prayed for my release from all past bondage. The loving God I serve (deep down I had always served Him), had led me to a safe haven where I could be restored into right relationship with Him and others.

I came to Renewal Camp with no expectations, but lots of desperation. God met me a thousand times more than I ever thought possible in one week. Peace now floods my soul and I have confidence I am free; yet I know it's all a process and I must still tread the journey of refining. Trials and hurts will come, life won't be easy, but the chains of the past have been broken.

The journey back has just begun.

P.S. If you'd enjoy a variety of diversities during your annual vacation, Renewal Camp is it! Joy, peace, intercession, fun, healing, relaxation, teaching, great food, games, worship, exercise, sleep - you name it, you'll have it!

# SACRED or SECULAR?

A number of years ago, a man was sent on a mission of mercy to a remote people group. While living among these foreigners and attempting to help them - for they were very needy - he adopted their cultural ways and form of dress, so that he could be more closely identified with them.

He communicated frequently with his family and spiritual leader back home, keeping them informed of his struggles and asking for counsel. He missed them a lot, and longed to be with them.

Eventually, despite adjusting so well to the new culture; despite his free offer of aid and assistance (services that were desparately needed), only a handful of the nationals had taken him at his word. It was a discouraging experience.

Then, to make matters worse, some political-religious leaders ganged up on him, and without a fair hearing, rid themselves of him. "We don't need you or your so-called remedies. Get lost!" they screamed.

Back in his home country, somewhat battered and bruised, he was gladly received, and in fact, had an excellent 're-entry' experience. He held no bitterness or hostility towards the people who had rejected him. Quite the contrary!

Instead of settling back into his old routines, and just sort of picking up where he'd left off - he'd done his missions thing, hadn't he? - instead of enjoying the satisfaction of having done his best, he entered into a rigorous discipline by starting a prayer ministry! It was a ministry of intercession before God, and in support of the few friends he'd made overseas.

And as if that wasn't enough, he also petitioned God on behalf of the very ones who had rejected him, pleading for mercy for the ungrateful wretches.

# Abitmoreaboutus . . .



Many YWAMers, present and past, learned of Joy's illness and major back surgery through Peter Jordan's compassionate report in the last IN TOUCH. So many sent her loving get-well cards, letters and phone messages, that acknowledging each one individually became an impossible task in our present circumstances. Therefore I would like to take this opportunity to express Joy's and my

heartfelt thanks for your concern and prayers. Believe me, we have been deeply ministered to and encouraged. Thank you, precious friends.

Joy's surgery was in February - over six months ago. She has not yet recovered, and still experiences frequent pain. Consequently she can only sit, walk or stand for brief periods of time. Recent X-rays also reveal degenerative disc arthritis.

But we are looking expectantly to the Divine Physician for this severe trial to eventually pass. Joy keeps worshipping God and trusting in His flawless character, desirous of learning all God has to teach her through this, the greatest-ever testing of her faith and endurance. Your on-going prayers would be greatly appreciated.

If you have been going through a prolonged trial or suffering, without understanding why there is no release, take comfort and encouragement from Isaiah 50:10. "Who among you fears the Lord? Who obeys the voice of His Servant? Who walks in darkness and has no light? Let him trust in the name of the Lord and rely upon his God."

Also remember the apostle Paul (2 Cor 4:8) "... was afflicted in every way... and perplexed..." By embracing God's sovereignty, and receiving His grace, there came a greater manifestation of the life of Jesus in him to others. (see verses 11 & 12)
