





GRACE IS SUFFICIENT

God wants you to know it's OK to be where you are. It's OK to fail. It's OK to be in pain. It's OK to not be out in some remote jungle, or some other place trying to be significant for Him. Unless we're living in known disobedience, we all need to allow the favor of God which is directed toward us - to bring us to a sense of security and well-being.

I have always been amazed at how I, as a YWAM leader, am more at peace with people being out of YWAM, than they are. The reason for this is because I really believe that God directs our lives, and that He does not expect as much from us as we often think He does.

There is a subtle attack of the enemy upon Christians that makes us feel we need to be somewhere else, and doing more, in order to please God.

The apostle Paul was given "a thorn in the flesh." (2 Cor 12:7-9) It frustrated him because he felt that success meant being with-



out that circumstance. He felt like he needed to be rid of the "thorn" in order to show his spirituality and please God. But God said, "My grace is sufficient for you" - even in the circumstance you're in. So Paul states in Philippians 4:11, "I have learned to be content in whatever circumstance I am."

The nature of grace is that you cannot do something, or be somewhere, to receive it. It's a free gift. Success in grace, is simply in the receiving of it; because if we can be successful without it, then we don't need it.

I am convinced therefore, that God is wanting us to receive grace where we are at. We don't have to go over there, be in another relationship, go to YWAM, get out of YWAM, change churches, go to the mission field, or even give more money, in order to receive the grace of God; He wants to extend grace to us right where we are. Truly knowing this, releases us from the frustration of thinking we should have been something, gone somewhere else, had another position or done something else.

I am convinced that in the ways of God, there is something totally fulfilling for you - and for the kingdom through you - in your present circumstances. The time has not been wasted. Don't wait for a future event. Just receive the grace of God, which is sufficient, and ask the Lord to show you what the overflow out of your life can be in terms of ministry, as you receive grace In his role as International Dean of the right where you are in your present circumstances.

There is grace to be single and a grace to be married; there's grace to be a widow and a grace to be old: there's grace to work and grace to take a holiday. What pleases God is not what you do or where you are, but your willingness to receive the grace He extends toward you. If you understand that victory does not always mean the cessation of circumstances, but sometimes means grace for those circumstances, then you will have total victory every day of your life.

THERE'S POWER IN THE BLOOD. While on outreach to a village in Northern India, a small team of YWAMers were presented with a unique ministry opportunity. A local man fell critically sick and was in immediate need of a blood transfusion. The only blood group match to be found was with the YWAM team leader. Despite less than adequate hygienic conditions, he donated. Later, another YWAMer returned to the village to discover that the sick man, who turned out to be a village elder, had recovered as a result of the transfusion. And furthermore, he had given his life to Christ, along with about a dozen other families in the village.

Miles from anywhere, surrounded by rugged mountains and set beside the rushing Salmon River, Riggins, Idaho is famous for at least a couple of things. One is the YWAM base a Rapid River Ranch (the site of IN TOUCH Renewal Camps!); the other is the Salmon River Challenge - whitewater rafting at its best (offered at the Camps!). Now there is a third feature; an espresso coffee bar run as an outreach by YWAM leaders, LeRoy & Debbie Shaw. Having lived three years in Seattle, they have imported a little West Coast "coffee culture," into sleepy Riggins (pop: 450) as a means of friendship evanaelism. Each cup of coffee is adorned with a Bible-based "Thought for the Day." and this leads into meaningful discussions. If you're driving through Riggins, stop for a free cup of the best - they're located halfway through town on the left, as you head north. Tell 'em Ed sent you - and oh yes, charge it to my account.

THE TIRANA BLESSING

Not to be confused with something that is happening in Toronto, Canada, this is a blessing that is coming upon the needy nation of Albania and its capital city Tirana, just now emerging from decades of deprivation under radical communism. This blessing is in the form of foundational aid, for a people who have been without as much as a peek into the rest of the world for over a aeneration. The aid comes in the practical form of aetting the medical, political, educational, business - and other - fabric of the nation going again. Together with other Christian endeavors, YWAM is in the thick of 'discipling a nation.' (Matt 28:19)

FIRE BELOW!

Dreaded words for sailors everywhere. Early in January, while on a mission of mercy to Ghana, West Africa (at the invitation of its government), fire broke out amidships aboard the M/V ANASTASIS. A fuel gauge for a diesel tank malfunctioned, allowing the flammable liquid to spill over onto the hot exhaust manifold of a generator. A blazing fire was raging within seconds. The well-trained crew reacted immediately, and rapidly the fire was smothered without injury to anyone. The damage was largely confined to wiring, gauges, controls and an incinerator. However, the estimated cost of repair is approximately \$150,000. Amazingly, the ship's ministry hardly missed a beat. Surgeries and dental work continued, patients in the ship's hospital were only slightly inconvenienced and a thankful crew of 341 were able to resume their duties. Corrie Ten Boom is one of my 20th Century faith heroes. She was an early speaker in my School of Evangelism in Kona, Hawaii in 1976.

Last June, the day before the start of our Dutch Renewal Camp, I had the blessing and privilege of visiting Tante Corrie's old home in Haarlem. climbed a narrow staircase to her bedroom, where many Jews were concealed in the Hiding Place, a narrow, cramped space behind the plaster wall. Back downstairs again. I spotted a beautiful two-sided embroidered crown, hanging in the dining room.

How well I remember Corrie talking about that piece of embroidery. One side, she'd say, is chaos, while the other side is a beautiful picture. Then she read us a poem:

My life is but a weaving, between my God and me I do not choose the colors, He worketh steadily. Ofttimes He weaveth sorrow, and I in foolish pride Forget He sees the upper, and I the underside. Not till the loom is silent, and shuttles cease to fly, Will God unroll the canvas and explain the reason why. The dark threads are as needful, in the skillful Weaver's hand, As the threads of gold and silver, in the pattern He has planned.

When I looked at the crown, I not only thought of life's challenges, but also of the relationships God gives us, every one of them important, many from different cultures and walks of life. We need each other to complete the picture. The underside of the embroidery is like the relationships that have come and gone; yet they're still part of our lives and often we can pick them up again. As God's family, we are blessed. Remember, every relationship is meaningful

- some more colorful than others, but all of them are important.

Renewal Camps are popping up all over! This past January, Jim & Ali Wescombe (our Kiwi Connection for YWAM Associates), led two camps in New Zealand, while Donna and I helped kick one off in Perth, Australia. Then in early March we had our first camp in Singapore. Our Northern Hemisphere summer is full, with a new camp in Branson, Missouri rounding out that season. (Branson is a unique little town that has become the family entertainment capital of North America.) Several other countries are asking to have camps, which thrills our hearts, because that's when we get to be with you!

But we can only do what the Lord tells us. I believe He has said we need a five-year plan for YWAM Associates International. In other words, whatever God has called you to right now, is your ministry. None of us is called to a 'part-time' ministry. We're all in ministry together - 'full-on, full-time.'

So if I meet you someplace and pop the 'M' question, now you know how to put me in my place!
