

But there's another land that fits this description, half a world and a complete cuture away from Israel. It is Chile. Santiago, the capital, is as far south of the equator as Israel is north and their climates are similar.

There are four YWAM Centers in Chile . . .

The main base is located in Santiago. Here three schools function; DTS, School of Biblical Studies (SBS) and a Pre-school. These programs operate on a shoe-string and in the tightest of quarters - a hundred people living in a space for thirty-five. But a building program is under way, and if you are a construction worker and available for 2 weeks to 2 months, God will use you in friendly Chile.

The schools have a great need for Spanish Reference Books. And did you know that the average monthly new-home mortgage payment in the U.S. and Canada, would send 3 or 4 Chileans to a DTS - including outreach?




WHELMED & GRUNTLED!

(or "How was it for you?")


We're told that 25% of those who go short-term, end up as long-termers. It behooves YWAM, and others, to do all we can to make that FIRST missionary experience a good one. Not just so that people will come back for more, but that they will infect others with the missions bug.

Perhaps your first trip to the mission field wasn't all you expected. Maybe it was a disaster. Possibly you're still 'bleeding', or know someone who is.

Hudson Taylor's introduction to missions was rough. It was a good thing he didn't rely on fellow missionaries for encouragement, because they pretty much cut him off. But he persevered and founded the China Inland Mission, whose fruit, to a large extent, we see in today's 50,000,000 Chinese believers.

Another one who had a rotten first term was Dick Hillis, (see Letters column). He went to China with the C.I.M. in 1935, and after a year or two, got so discouraged, he almost quit. Today he is a missionary statesman, having founded a new ministry when China closed down in 1949.

If you still have a bad taste in your mouth from something that happened - or didn't happen and haven't been able to give it to the Lord, would you write and tell us about it? Or perhaps encourage someone else who's still struggling, to contact us. We care.

In his younger, unredeemed days he sometimes tried to prove, with his fists, that he was a match for men much larger!

That was Alan. Once a Christian, nothing and nobody were too great a challenge for this feisty little bantam-weight. The Greek Government even tried to lock him up for giving away a Bible.

Pray all night? - count on Alan. Under spiritual attack by the enemy? - call for Alan Williams. Need someone to speak prophetically into a situation? - Alan was your man. (His friends used to joke that when Alan was away from the base, it became a 'non-prophet' organization.)

He only feared God.
