GOD IS FAIR DINKUM

In Australia we would say that "God is fair dinkum about His promises." He is truly genuine, as good as His word, means what He says. That He has unchanging purposes even for us today, 'the heirs of the promise.' In fact, God was so fair dinkum, that He "swore by Himself" about one of His promises (Heb 6:13).

That promise, that unchanging purpose in God's heart, was first given to Abraham, father of the Jews (Gen 12:2-3). God promised to bless Abraham and his children, and through them all the peoples of the earth. Today, all Christians are Abraham's children - fellow heirs - having been grafted in to his family tree (Rom 11:17). Therefore God wants to use all believers to bless all peoples of the earth.

Is that something you can wholeheartedly commit yourself to?

Does it mean you must 'get up and go' - again, if you've already
been? Can you only bless the peoples, (families, tribes, people
groups) of this earth by physically being among them?

I am writing this in Indonesia where there are 1,200 such 'families.' Some like the Sundanese who are 38 million strong, know little or nothing of the blessing that awaits them. Others of these 'families' are tiny by comparison. Many have no church among them and have hardly anyone even praying for them. In all the world there are thousands of these family groups.

Wouldn't you like to be coupled to the unchanging purpose of God? Wouldn't you, right there where God has called you, want to be a link in the 'chain' of blessing? You can.

It is my conviction that former YWAMers especially - individuals and families - could adopt one of these groups of people that have not heard about the blessing that is 'on hold' for them. This would be something between you and your adopted family. A commitment you would make.

Once adopted, you could pray for, gather information about, and seek God's blessing on your new family. Then, "This hope we have as an anchor of the soul" (Heb 6:19), may become their hope. The blessing you have so freely received, could release God's promise, that "He swore by Himself," upon them.



A MORE THAN MODEST RESPONSE

In the last Edition, we presented 'A Modest Proposal,' in which you were invited to partner with us, by sharing the load of producing and then mailing IN TOUCH around the world. (We're closing in on 10,000 Associates in more than 60 countries!) We mentioned that we were laboring under a \$6000 shortfall, and asked if the ministry of YWAM Associates was really on God's heart.

The response was more than modest! It was downright humbling. Phone calls and letters came in from all over this planet. Without exception, people said things like, "Keep going," "Don't give up, and "We need this." One wrote "I've been greatly encouraged by each issue of IN TOUCH... especially thrilled to see ways we can encourage specific people in ministry...it's on my heart to give \$ to IN TOUCH, but finances are limited, with many individual YWAMers on my heart to support well...enclosed is what I have at this time..."

And from all over the world, gifts small and large came in - sufficient to wipe out the \$6000 in debts, and pay all production and mailing costs for the last IN TOUCH. PITCAIRN COUNTDOWN

Almost lost in the vastness of the far reaches of the South Pacific, is tiny Pitcairn Island-the world's smallest country, with a population of under 70. Survivors of the mutiny on HMS Bounty, these hardy people are cut off from the rest of us. Ships visit infrequently.

Pitcairn is the only country in the world in which YWAM has not yet had the opportunity to minister. No missionary organization has ever worked in every nation of the world. Yet Jesus said, "Go into all the world."



WHEELS OF STEEL

A YWAM train? You must be kidding! YWAM's going to ride the rails? New meaning to DTS, (Diesel Training School?) Pullman dorms? Dining cars? Clickety clack, on the railroad track? Yes, and more!

We have ships, don't we? It wasn't too long ago, some of us had trouble believing God for just one. Now there are three, with plans for ten! A ship is a floating, mobile base, limited to ports. But not really from there.

Similarly with a train. Tied to the tracks though it may be, it will chug into smaller centers, never before touched by outreaches.

The train vision was birthed in the heart of Uli Kortsch, of the rest of the vision - the YWAM's Canadian Director. Or by video, he couldlook over the shoulder of a surgeon, as he deftly accomplishes miracles in the operating room of the M/V ANASTASIS.

So far, The Train is comprised limited, since teams can reach out of one beautiful, antique sleeper car, built for the Canadian Pacific Railway in 1929. Parked on a siding near Kelowna, BC, it is currently being restored and upgraded. The Rosemere, for that is her name, waits in solitary splendor, for the arrival

- · Non-Westerners account for about one in three of YWAM staff? (Yea!)

- · More than half of all YWAMers are serving in their own country? (Hmmmm.)
- The average age of a base leader is 37? (And most likely married.)
- YWAM staffers have over 2000

children? (Hmmmmmmmm.)

 As of May 1990, there were 360 OPLOCs in 100 countries? (Thought you'd never ask - it's an Operating Location, like a base.)

KENTLEIGH TORRENTE, Age 34

This, the eighth edition of IN TOUCH, is dedicated to the memory of Kentleigh Torrente, YWAM Associate.

Beirut. The very name calls up images of horror. Civil war. 'Christian' vs Moslem. Bombs. Bloodshed. Broken buildings. Broken people. Hopelessness.

It was hope that drew South African Kentleigh Torrente, an eleven-year YWAM veteran, back to strifetorn Lebanon. His love for the people had been birthed in his heart, while serving there from 1982-85. Those were some of the worst years. Then



YWAM withdrew because of the dangers.

But Kentleigh's heart never withdrew from Lebanon. Feeling called there, yet unable to return with YWAM, he joined the Bible Society early in 1990. His ministry was to distribute Bibles and food amidst the terror of ripped-apart Beirut. There, on October 13th, in the line of duty, he was killed by gunfire.

Hear what his colleagues said about Kentleigh. Iain Muir, Regional Director for Africa: "I knew him well. He was a sensitive, dedicated Christian. His love for the Lebanese people was evident; his mother says that he died among the people he loved."

Don Price, Director for South Africa: "Kentleigh was meek gentle, soft-spoken - not the type you would picture in a war zone. Yet he took on a challenge that most of us would never consider: going into a physical battlefield to bring life to the spiritually dying... Kentleigh answered the call of God, and completed the task assigned to him."

Kentleigh may not have been "mighty according to the flesh" (1 Cor 1:26). But he was mighty in God, mighty in spirit, mighty in obedience. Even mighty in death. He's the sort of person we'll someday find listed as a 'Hero of the Faith.' The sort of person you read about in Hebrews 11. The sort of person we remember and honor.
